

# **Arbutus Traffic Calming Construction**

As you may have already noticed, traffic calming installation began along East Drive Arbutus on February 22. There will now be a raised intersection and two raised crosswalks, and construction may already be finished by the time you are now reading this. My office expresses due thanks to the Baltimore County Department of Public Works for their efforts.



### House Bill 814: Juvenile Law

Throughout this session, the many opinions voiced by Marylanders about juvenile justice reform have not fallen on deaf ears. The Speaker of the House has brought a juvenile reform bill that reflects the recommendations from the Department of Juvenile Services, the State's Attorney's Association, the Public Defender's Office, the Chiefs and Sheriffs, and many other stakeholders. This is what it does:

First, the bill brings principals, superintendents, and service providers to the table; by adding them to a commission on Juvenile Justice, key roleplayers in the education of our youth become directly involved in this process. Additionally, the bill will require 10-12 year olds that commit crimes of violence, possess weapons, torture animals, or make sexual contact using violence to immediately come under Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) supervision. On top of this, DJS will be required to move faster, making an

intake decision in two days or less. Simply, kids will be closer to services faster. Regardless of whether DJS goes through with a case, they will also provide direct communication with victims and police officers while providing the case file to the State's Attorney.

Juvenile Law has been "top of mind" for many legislators throughout the current session. To provide your input on this bill (or any others), please do not hesitate to reach out to my office. I value the opinions and perspectives of my constituents highly, and look forward to hearing from you.
